- Presentation by Trash Caulin
 - Caulin is an influencer who used his platform to promote cleaning the environment. He has partnered with Visit St. Pete Clearwater for education collaborations like Unwind & Be Kind using social media for education. Caulin pushed for used beach toy boxes on the beach, Redington, Madeira, and St. Pete Beach all have installed them. - Coastal Communication PSA with Ballyhoo
 - Discussion to have beach rules and reminders as well as Big C Meeting ads if council would like to move forward. - Representative Berny Jacques- District 59
 - o Item was discussed after the Administer Oath of Office.
 - Pinellas County has received \$10 million in government appropriations. \$680K went to Amplify Clearwater to build an Entrepreneurship Business Center focused on tourism field including certificates, training and more. Center will also help incubate business to help them grow faster. \$1 million will be going to St. Pete College for a Manufacturing Lab. SPC will help with certificates, placement, and training.
- Legislative Update Representative Linda Chaney- District 61
 - o Item was discussed after Item 11. City Events
 - O Rep Chaney's Campaign Manager JP Gutierrez spoke about the last session. A total of 12 bills were sponsored/co-sponsored. The one they are the most proud of is a bill banning balloon releases. The bill is on Gov. DeSantis desk who is set to sign this week. This will not only help the ocean but the balloons tend to land in farms and cattle eat the balloons. Mayor Will would like to thank Rep Chaney for voting no on the short term rental bill.
